




#### Bishop George Crenshaw Central South Africa Episcopal District

Born in Jefferson County Alabama, George Crenshaw was ordained as a Christian Minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church in 1986. He is married to the former Laurenna Hardy of Birmingham, Alabama and is the father of two children Quentin Dewayne and Kennedy Diane.

Bishop Crenshaw has had a blessed and productive life in ministry having served in the capacities of Pastor and Presiding Elder. As a pastor, Bishop Crenshaw has served in Calcis, Alabama; Indianapolis, Indiana; Cheraw, SC; Lancaster SC, and presently is serving in Smyrna, Georgia at the Shaw Temple A.M.E Zion Church. His position as Presiding Elder has placed him in the Indianapolis District, Cheraw-Bennettsville District and Lancaster District.

Among his many accolades, Bishop Crenshaw holds an Honorary Doctorate Degree from both Clinton College and Livingstone College; a B.A. from Indiana University, a Masters of Divinity from Hood Theological Seminary, and a high school diploma from McAdory High School in McCalla, Alabama.

Bishop Crenshaw has exercised his dominant spiritual gifts of Administration, Teaching, Shepherding and Preaching to fashion a ministry designed to empower and edify.

In addition to his educational accomplishments, Bishop Crenshaw has held many outstanding memberships and positions as well as having been recognized for many distinguished acclaims. He has served as president of the Cheraw Branch of the NAACP. He is a member of the A.M.E. Zion Connectional Budget Board and served as First Vice President of the Presiding Elder's Council 2001-2005. Pastor Crenshaw is a past board member of the Chesterfield General Hospital, Cheraw SC.

Bishop Crenshaw is a five time delegate to the A.M.E Zion Church General Conference, delegate to the 2001 World Methodist Conference in Brighton, England, 2006 World Methodist Conference in Seoul Korea and 2011 World Methodist Conference in South Africa. Bishop Crenshaw served as an Executive Board Member for the period 2006-11.

He is a 2000 James Varick Freedom Medal recipient and is a past President of Hood Theological Seminary Student Government Association. Bishop Crenshaw was a contributing Writer of the A.M.E Zion Church Christian Education Manual 2002.

He was recognized as the 1999 "Man of the Year" by the Lambda Iota Iota Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., and recipient of the "Outstanding Community Leader" award from the Bennettsville Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Bishop Crenshaw is a community activist and was recognized as "Citizen of the Year" by the Cheraw Branch of the NAACP.

He is the founder of the Zion Center Community Development Cooperation in Cheraw, SC as well as the founder of the Cheraw-Bennettsville District A.M.E Zion Church Mass Choir.

Bishop Crenshaw presently serves as Chairman of the Budget Committee, Home Missions Treasurer, Vice Chairman of the Strategic Planning Committee, and Member of the Admissions Committee and Conference Examiners for the Georgia Conference of the A.M.E Zion Church. Pastor Crenshaw is Founder and President of the Shaw Temple Biblical and Leadership

Institute.

Bishop Crenshaw is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He is a Life member of the Connectional Lay Council of the A.M.E. Zion Church and a Life member of the NAACP. Pastor Crenshaw received the 2011 Atlanta Gospel Choice Award as one of the "Chosen 10 Pastors" in the State of Georgia.



# Bishop Hilliard Dogbe Western West Africa Episcopal District

Bishop Hilliard K. Dela Dogbe served as the Chief of Staff and Protocol of the Western West Africa Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Zion Church, an area covering Liberia, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana and Togo. He was responsible for the planning and coordination of all

operations and activities within the Episcopal District, together with the provision of leadership and effective management of all work emanating to and from the Bishop.

Besides being an astute administrator, Bishop Dogbe is an academic, a church builder, and a pastor with a proven ministry in Ghana and beyond. His passion for multi-generational ministry finds high premium in his ministry to the youth and the aged. He places much emphasis on the "wholistic" development of each individual and the total well-being of all. With his interest in training and raising Christian leaders for the mission and ministry of the Church in the world, Bishop Dogbe since 1999 became part of the training team traveling widely across all the Annual Conferences in the Episcopal Area enhancing the capacity of our ministers through teachings and leadership development programs.

Having started his itinerant ministry in the A.M.E. Zion Church in 1990 when he was received into Conference, after four years as an exhorter and a local preacher, he has served the church in many capacities locally in the episcopal area and at the connectional level. He has also represented the church on ecumenical boards in Ghana..



#### Reverend Dr. Eleazar Merriweather

Reverend Dr. Eleazar Merriweather was born in Demopolis, Alabama. He is a graduate of John Essex High School, Demopolis, AL; Tuskegee University, Tuskegee, Alabama where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering (1981); a graduate of Johnson Bible College, Knoxville, TN where he received a Masters of Arts in New Testament Studies and Preaching Exposition (1997) and he received a

Doctor of Divinity, Livingstone College, May 2011.

Reverend Merriweather is very active on all levels of the A.M.E. Zion Church Connection, local community, and the city of Detroit. He served as Administrative Assistant to the Presiding Bishops, Dean of the Rochester-Brown School of Ministry for the Central Africa and Mozambique Annual Conferences; Assistant Dean for the Mid-West Episcopal District Leadership Training Institute, Conference Secretary of the Michigan Annual Conference, and the Southeast Regional Advisory Board for Hospice of Michigan, and the International Director of Discipleship Formation.

Reverend Merriweather served as Pastor of the Lomax Temple A.M.E. Zion Church, Knoxville, TN (1990-2000), where he led the congregation in building a new Church, St. Luke A.M.E. Zion Church, Grand Rapids, MI (2000-2009), and currently the St. Paul A.M.E. Zion Church, Detroit, MI (2009-); there he led the congregation in paying-off approximately \$400,000 in debt. God has tremendously blessed the ministry, and thus all three Churches under his leadership have experienced rebirth, renewal and restoration. Reverend Merriweather is a dynamic teacher, preacher, and leader.

In addition to his pastorates, Reverend Merriweather served as Presiding Elder of the Western Michigan District for one year, and he currently serves as Presiding Elder of the Trinidad District, Trinidad & Tobago Conference.

Before receiving his call to pastor, Reverend Merriweather was employed at Lockheed Martin Energy Systems, Inc. (1981-2001), Oak Ridge, TN. During his tenure there, he held positions of Systems Manager for the Emergency Power System, Site Energy Conservation Manager, Acting Division Training Manager, Group Leader, and Field Maintenance Engineer. Reverend Merriweather is married to Rev. Wanda Merriweather, they have two daughters; LaQuitta and Alesia, and three grandchildren.
