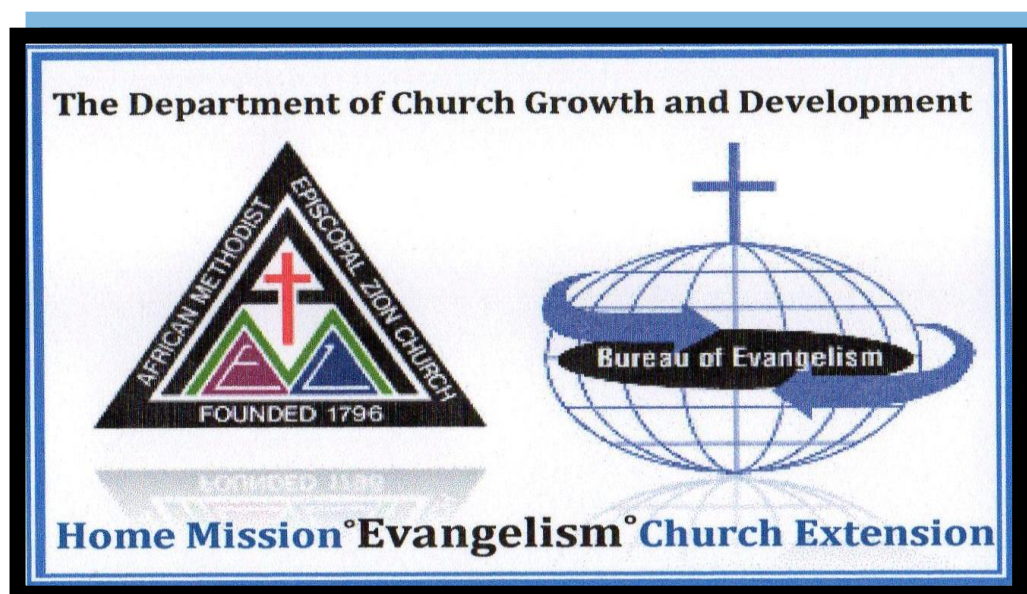

Director's Statement to the Connectional Council and the Board of Bishops

To the President of the Board of Bishop, Bishop Dennis V. Proctor, the Senior Bishop, Bishop George E. Battle Jr., the host Bishop, Bishop Darryl B. Starnes Sr., other members of the Board of Bishops and the Connectional Council: Greetings in the name of the Father of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! This is my report as Executive Director of the Department of Church Growth and Development with highlights, financial audit with an independent auditor's letter, evangelistic endeavors and an overview of the work.

The Department of Church Growth and Development - Home Mission

The Department of Church Growth and Development has maintained its pre-existing obligations providing assistance to Ministers, Churches and responded to all emergency requests from the Episcopal Districts. The Administrative Board of Church Growth and Development has held regular conference calls in an effort to clarify goals, directions and departmental expectations. Under the Leadership of Bishop Darryl B. Starnes and the administrative board members, the subcommittees have worked the following areas: Church Revitalization, Connectional Prayer Ministry, Discipleship Ministry, Evangelism and Church Planting.

The department has responded to two church plant requests. Presently, the Department is supporting Rev. Charles Thurman Jr. with \$300.00 per month and Rev. Derrick Lamar Smith with \$700.00 for a rental space. The Department of Church Growth and Development prayer ministry led by our International Prayer Coordinator, Rev. Dr. Eric Leake has sponsored and participated in several calls to prayer for our Church and Country. The General Conference Prayer service was well attended and the offering amount was \$4,619.01. The prayer ministry provides ongoing prayer support for the general meeting of the denomination. An overview of the day to day operations of Home Mission, the receipts and disbursements are included in this report.

The Department of Church Growth and Development - Evangelism

Decision Day – 2016 Decision Day theme was “The Freedom Church: Re-Focusing on Our Purpose” The theme was designed to call God's Church to bountiful fruitfulness, blessed obedience and bold witness. Decision Day is rooted and grounded in the quest to see our members, children, youth and adults move beyond religion and ritual to authentic relationships with God through Jesus Christ. While still targeting our youth and children, the Decision Day Observance must broaden its scope in order to reach people of all ages who are in need of making a life-changing decision for Christ. The Decision Day Packets were sent out to the pastors during the month of September. 103 churches responded to the Department request, returning the forms and sending gifts in the amount of \$6,564.67.

2017 Spiritual Emphasis Week – Spiritual Emphasis Week offers an opportunity for each local church to begin the year on a high spiritual note. The entire denomination was encouraged to participate as the presiding elder districts gather Sunday through Friday for prayer, praise, and proclamation of the word. This annual event was culminated with the clergy and laity of the Presiding Elder District coming together for a special service on Saturday. The suggested theme for Spiritual Emphasis Week 2017 was “Teaching Believers to Live and Serve as Christ's Ambassadors” The study text was 2 Corinthians 5:1-21 - 2 Corinthians 7:1-2. I was privilege to share Spiritual Emphasis week at the Outland Memorial AME Zion Church, Fort Worth, Texas and the Saint Mark (Vineyard) AME Zion Church, Dallas, Texas.

Ecumenical Highlights of the Executive Director

Participated in the 21st World Methodist Conference, Houston, Texas held at the Hilton Americas Houston, Texas, August 31st thru September 4th, 2016, I was invited to the pre-Conference, post Conference events and served on the Evangelism Committee.

Participated in The African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church and the Evangelical Lutheran Church partnership event for “A Day of Prayer for Charlotte”, October 5, 2016 hosted by St. Luke Evangelical Lutheran Church, Charlotte, NC. The day began with conversation, continued with prayer out in the community, and ended with a worship service. The keynote speaker was The Rev. Albert Starr of the ELCA African Descent office. A special thanks to Rev. Dr J. Elvin Sadler, President Dr. Vergel Lattimore and other AME Zionites who participated in the event.

Participated in the Evangelism Connection’s Bi-Annual Meeting hosted by the United Churches of Canada, held in Toronto, Canada October 2016 at the United Church of Canada Headquarters and the May 2017 meeting in Phoenix, Arizona hosted by the Reformed Church of America.

Served as the keynote speaker for the Cumberland Fayetteville Ministerial Council’s Martin Luther King Jr. Countywide Prayer Breakfast held January 2017 at the Cumberland County Crown Coliseum, Fayetteville, North Carolina with more 2000 in attendance. I have invited to serve as the keynote for the Lee County Martin Luther King Jr. Breakfast and community event in January 2018.

Served as one of the keynote speakers and assisted in planning for “The Bold Like Jesus Conference” held February 2-4, 2017 at Trinity AME Zion Church, Greensboro, NC. 50 members of the AME Zion Church family registered and participated in the event. Rev. Dr. Darin Mitchell and the Trinity Church are to be commended for a job well done! A special thanks to Bishop Darryl B. Starnes and Bishop Kenneth Monroe for the participation in the event.

The Evangelism Articles - Zion’s Evangel - *Zion’s Evangel* appears in each issue of the Missionary Seer thanks to Dr. Dwight Bernard Cannon and his staff. I also continue to provide article in our web Newsletter; on the Evangelism Connection’s website and on the Bureau’s Website: www.beamezion.org.

The Quadrennial Evangelism Congress - The 2017 Quadrennial Evangelism Congress, was held at the beautiful Dorothy Walls Conference and Retreat Resort, Black Mountain, NC on April 18 - 21, 2017. Although the participation from the denomination at the Evangelism Congress has been low, the administrative board has decided that the subsequent evangelism congresses should remain a free standing event. 228 persons attended the congress and 167 registered for the event. A special thanks to Bishop George Battle for his assistance during the meeting, administrative board member, Dr. Yvonne Tracey and the AARP organization their financial assistance, our speakers, presenters and other members of the Administrative Board of Church Growth and development.

Evangelism Website – www.beamezion.org The Bureau of Evangelism maintains a site which offers many valuable tools for our constituents around the country and across the world. The feedback received has been overwhelmingly positive. Thanks to Rev. William Dudley, Episcopal Director of the Washington-Oregon Conference for his skill, generosity and constant work in maintaining and updating the site. We also maintain three webpages on Facebook

Evangelism Networking Opportunities -The Christian Education Department partnered with the Department of Church Growth and Development to provide evangelistic training during their Winter Meeting. The director taught (3) workshops on evangelism and provided altar support and follow-up for 30 persons who accepted Christ during the CED winter meeting in Washington, DC. The Connectional Lay Council has provided opportunity for the director to present an evangelistic Bible Study at their meeting in Knoxville, Tennessee. These partnerships have allowed me to raise awareness of evangelism and increased the distribution of evangelistic materials across the AME Zion Connection.

The World Methodist Evangelism Division of the World Methodist Church invited a number of AME Zion, evangelistic-minded pastors and their spouses to participate in their extensive evangelistic training during their 2017 Order of the Flame Conference. I encourage our Board of Bishops to continue to send leaders from across the denomination to experience this rewarding, Wesleyan/Methodist training opportunity. The Director, along with other directors from the Wesleyan/Methodist family participated in this event. The World Methodist Director of Evangelism, Rev. Dr. Kimberly Wiseman held this year's conference, March 11-17, 2017 at Saint Simon Island, GA at the Epworth by the Sea. This year, 28 pastors and spouses of the AME Zion Church participated in the event.

Theme: Spiritual Directions for a New Generation

The Book of Discipline of our Church directs that every Sunday Church School shall emphasize "Decision Day" annually in the month of October. It further directs that each Sunday Church School should undertake an evangelistic quota for active membership. In the recent past, the Decision Day Observance has also been an opportunity for the local churches to share financial gifts in support of the Department of Church Growth and Development: *Evangelism & Home Mission*. While financial gifts are welcomed during this observance, the Department of Church Growth and Development is placing its greatest emphasis upon decisions for Christ and faithfulness in ministry.

The 2017 Theme is "**Spiritual Directions for a New Generation.**" The selected Scripture lessons are 2 Timothy 3:1-13; 4:1-5. Our purpose as New Testament, born again believers is to do the work of an evangelist, faithfully sharing the word of Faith that brings salvation to all who believe in their hearts and confess with their mouth the Lord Jesus Christ.

During these perilous times many teachers have wandered into error, away from the pure word of God, gratifying their lusts, and to please the itching ears of those around them. The church must provide accurate spiritual directions for a generation looking for answers. People need sound doctrine. We must proclaim the word of God that is searching, plain, and purposeful. There is a wide difference between the word of God and the word of erring teachers; the one is sound doctrine, the word of truth, the other is only fables.

Those who have turned unto fables have first turned away their ears from the truth, for they cannot hear and mind both, any more than they can serve two masters. It is possible to be overtaken in a fault, to neglect one's duty, and to lose one's soul. Apostle Paul encourages Timothy to watchfulness. Watching unto prayer prevents all these evils. We must endure afflictions, not allowing difficulties to cause us to abandon the truth, nor relax in our zeal for the salvation of men.

Apostle Paul highlights and presses a fourfold duty upon Timothy and other who take this ministry seriously; 1. Be watchful in all things because false teachers will be set him on every side; therefore guard and watch everywhere. 2. Be courageous enduring afflictions: he that fears the frowns of men can never discharge his duty faithfully to God. 3. Be loyal: Do the work of an evangelist which is an extraordinary office, to assist the apostles in preaching and publishing the gospel from place to place; they watered what the apostles planted. 4. Be sincerity: Make full proof of thy ministry; so fulfill all the parts of it, that none may charge thee with the neglect of any part of thy duty.

This year 2017, let the world see that the foremost work of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, the most important and only work is to reach, win and disciple souls for God. Decision Day is rooted and grounded in the quest to see our members, children, youth and adults move beyond religion and ritual to authentic relationships with God through Jesus Christ. While still targeting our youth and children, the Decision Day Observance must broaden its scope in order to reach people of all ages who are in need of making a life-changing decision for Christ.
